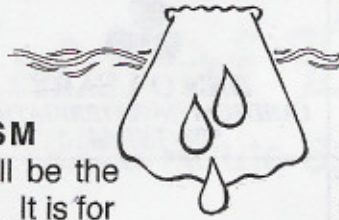
Today a second collection is for the parish debt, and next weekend a second collection will be to help us with our winter fuel costs.
