Recognizing that "with God all things are possible," people of faith are praying that this effort will help bring an end to the tragedy of abortion. 40 Days for Life is a focused pro-life campaign that has already mobilized over 350,000 people worldwide, saved more than 2,800 lives from abortion, led the conversion of 38 abortion workers and seen five abortion facilities close. 40 Days for Life is made up of three components: *Prayer & Fasting* - believers throughout our area are invited to join together for 40 days of fervent prayer and fasting for an end to abortion. *Peaceful Vigil* - standing for life through a 40-day peaceful public witness outside the abortion clinic at 150 Emory St., Attleboro, MA near the National Shrine of Our Lady of LaSalette. *Community Outreach* - help take a positive, upbeat pro-life message through media efforts, advocacy and public visibility. HOLLY FAIR UPDATE

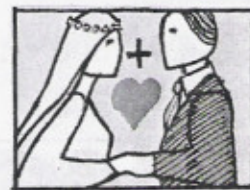
